About this lesson

To introduce a variety of trends related to work and employment, students will learn about job projections and outlook to understand how their career plans may be shaped by factors beyond their control.

Learning objectives

By the end of this lesson, students will:

- learn about job projections and outlook
- analyze factors that impact job demand, such as changes in technology, demographics, business practices or production methods, consumer preferences, and workplace restructuring
- explore how their career plans may be shaped by demand for a career that interests them

Xello entry point

Activity 1: Compare career demand



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20 minutes

Inquiry prompts

- Are jobs that interest me in demand?

Before you begin

- Ensure students have saved 3 careers before starting this lesson. It's also recommended that students complete the Matchmaker assessment (phase 1) and the Explore career matches lesson.

Teaching strategies

In this activity, students will review their saved careers to determine the job outlook and reflect on how they feel about the career and why the demand for it may influence their decision to pursue it.

- 1 Provide the [instructions](#) on the next page to your students.
- 2 Optional: Ask students to contribute the career demand status for 3 careers of interest in an online form or visual tally chart. Lead a discussion around job projections based on the class data.

For 3 career profiles, students will update how they feel about the career and add a short reflection about the career demand status.

Culminating project tip

Add your students' questions about career demand to the discussion guide. For example: was your career in high demand when you entered the field? Was job outlook an important factor when making career path decisions? What do you think the future outlook is for careers in your industry?

Compare career demand

Student instructions

- 1 Navigate to your saved careers in Xello and complete the following for 3 careers:
 - Review the career profile.
 - Identify the career demand (stable, increasing, high or decreasing).
 - At the top of the profile, choose an emoji to indicate how you feel about this career.
 - Within **My notes**, add a short reflection in regards to the identified career demand. How might this factor influence your decision to pursue this career? How might your level of effort in the early stages of the career choice differ based on the demand? If a career you love is in low demand, what would make you a stronger competitor for the job?
- 2 After reviewing 3 careers, proceed to the Xello Lesson called **Career demand** to gain a better understanding of trends that impact job outlook.

Activity 2: Xello Lesson: Career demand

About this activity

In the first activity, students reviewed their saved careers to determine the job outlook and reflect on the impact this could have on whether or not they decide to pursue them.

In this activity, students will complete the **Career demand** lesson in Xello to learn about 5 common career demand factors that have the biggest impact on a career they like.

Inquiry prompts

- What does career demand mean? What are employment projections?
- What careers are in demand in your area? Why?
- How will changes in career demand affect your career choices?
- What jobs do you think will be hot in the future? What jobs do you think won't exist in the future?
- What factors and forces influence the demand for careers (e.g. demographics, automation)?
- What skills or knowledge do you think you will need to be prepared for the jobs of the future?

Before you begin

Before diving in with your students:

1. Create a copy or download the [Career demand slide presentation](#) to use as a helpful teaching aid before and after the Xello lesson.
2. Review the slides (including the speaker notes section) for suggested discussion strategies and prompts.
3. Update slide 5 of the presentation with your students' Xello sign in format. If you don't know your students' Xello login format check out [Sign in to Xello](#) for support.

Teaching strategies

Use the following strategies to set your students up for success:

- 1 Before students start the Xello lesson, take 5 minutes to have them review and consider the inquiry prompts from the **Warm up** activity slide of the [Career demand slide presentation](#), or choose your own. Advise students to keep these questions in mind as they complete the lesson. You will revisit these questions with them in the **Exit activity** afterwards.
- 2 Help your students log in to their Xello account. Project your screen as you model how to navigate to the lesson using your demo student account. From the student dashboard, click on a lesson to get started. If the lesson you want isn't visible, access it by selecting **View all lessons** below the lessons shown.
- 3 Students finished early? If students have time after completing the Xello lesson, encourage them to do an online search for 2-3 job postings related to

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Activity 2: Xello Lesson: Career demand



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one of their saved careers and add the links to the **Helpful articles** section of the saved career in Xello. Did their search results give them any insight into the potential demand for the career?

- 4 Once students have completed the Xello lesson, return to the [Career demand slide presentation](#) to have students revisit the inquiry prompts you posed at the beginning of class.
- 5 **Classroom discussion strategy: I used to think: Now I think:** Encourage students to rate how important they believe it is for them to understand the demand for a career before pursuing it. Students can use a scale from 1-3 to rate importance. A rating of 1 equals not important, a rating of 2 equals important, and a rating of 3 equals very important.
- 6 Ask students if their thoughts about the importance of understanding the demand for a career have changed or stayed the same since completing the Xello lesson. Example: I used to think it was not important (a rating of 1) but now I think it's important (a rating of 2).
- 7 If their rating has changed, what do they think caused this change in thinking? If their rating has stayed the same, why?

Activity 3: Filter by demand

Inquiry prompts

- What does the future career landscape look like?

Before you begin

- Ensure students have saved 3 careers before starting this lesson. It's also recommended that students complete the **Matchmaker** assessment (phase 1) and the **Explore Career Matches** lesson.

Teaching strategies

In this activity, students will explore careers that are increasing in demand within a career cluster that is suggested for them (which is based on their Xello profile). Students will then select 1 new career to save and reflect on.

- 1 Provide the [instructions](#) on the next page to your students.
- 2 Optional: Share with your students how job demand has or has not influenced your own career path. What was the teacher job market like when you entered the career? What trends impact careers in education?

Culminating project tip

Filter by demand

Student instructions

Which careers are projected to be increasing in demand? What factors do you think are influencing the increase? Do any of these careers interest you and why?

- 1 From **Explore careers** in Xello, click **More filters** and select **Increasing** career demand. Choose 1 or 2 **Career clusters** that are suggested for you, or a cluster that is of interest.
- 2 Review the results based on the selected filters. Which career surprises you the most? Which career would you consider a possibility for yourself? Review at least 3 career profiles before saving one.
- 3 At the top of the profile, choose an emoji to indicate how you feel about this career.
- 4 Within **My notes**, add a short reflection in regards to the increasing career demand:
 - Which factor do you think is impacting the demand? Why do you think this? (Technological, Economical, Social, Demographic, Business practices, Consumer behaviour, or Workplace restructuring).
 - Consider checking out the *occupational projection summaries* on the [Canadian occupational projection system](#) to support your answers. Use the NOC title search field with the **contains** option selected to find more information about a particular career's projections results.
