About this lesson

At this location, students learn about occupations in the **Creative** career path. Students also develop art-related skills as they demonstrate their creativity, and practice basic color theory by mixing primary colors to make secondary colors.

Learning objectives

By the end of this lesson, students will demonstrate their understanding of basic color theory by mixing primary colors to make secondary colors.

Discussion prompts

- Why is it important to work together?
- What does **creative** mean?
- What are some other **Creative** jobs you can think of?
- Who works at an art gallery?
- What is the difference between primary and secondary colors?

Lesson breakdown

10-15
minutes

Activity 1 - Discussion

Think-pair-share: Direct students to choose a partner. Share the discussion questions with the class and give them 2-3 minutes to consider their answers. Then have them turn to their partners and take turns sharing their answers.

Optional **Think-pair-share-square:** Once students have shared their answers with their partners, direct them to join up with another pair and take turns sharing their answers.

Activity 2 - Career Town location: Art gallery

The first time students visit this location, they are asked to help sort out some chaos caused by a missing worker. After completing a 3-minute mini-game, students receive a report of another missing worker. Information about the missing workers is stored as a case file in the **People** section of students' **Dpads**. The character then presents students with a clue left behind by Ernestine - a note! Before moving on to a new location, Detective Jill quizzes students about the workers at the location and their occupations. After completing the quiz, students are rewarded with a badge, which is kept in the **Badges** app of their **Dpad**.

Activity 3 - Colors all around us!

Discuss with students the difference between primary and secondary colors, and help them make a list of primary and secondary colors. Then, have them go on a color hunt and record on the worksheet the primary and secondary colors that they find. Finally, ask them to choose two primary colors and the secondary color they make and create a work of art on the worksheet using those colors.

You're the artist: In this game, students help the curator furnish the art gallery's latest exhibition by painting some artwork.

To play: Students use the drawing tools to create original works of art or build on one of the templates provided.
